SILVIA BERBEC

President of Pro Refugiu Association and Lawyer in Bucharest Bar.

As president, she is representing the Romanian NGO at events organized by stakeholders at EU level, reunions of the EU Civil Society Platform against Trafficking in Human Beings.

As lawyer she has expertise in criminal law, refugee law during the years providing legal assistance for victims of human trafficking, asylum seekers, refugees.

Over time, she was involved as legal expert in international projects on topics related to international law, migration, human trafficking, trainings for lawyers, prosecutors and judges.

CLEMENTINE EBERT

Lawyer in Brussels and Paris Bar and currently jurist at ADDE asbl (NGO for migrants' rights) in Brussels.

As a lawyer, she has expertise in refugee law both in France and Belgium, providing legal assistance for asylum seekers and refugees and notably victims of human trafficking.

She collaborates with Human Rights NGOs by giving legal advice as well as training for lawyers and non-lawyers (France: LDH, ATMF, Laboratoires d'Auversvilliers; Belgium; ADDE, LDH). She is currently a member of LDH Belgium "Commission des Etrangers".

MD, Psychologist, Psychotherapist.

She has researched and published on the role of NGOs in supporting vulnerable groups, on the protection of witnesses, on the rights of children victims of trafficking and on victims of domestic violence.
